#### 3.0 Street Shade Tree matters

- 2 oak trees (located along Railroad Avenue) badly damaged by bacterial leaf scorch are set for removal at the Hightstown Housing Authority. Replacements to take place in the Fall 2017.
- Morgan Grill – 2 pear trees located in the front of the restaurant – owner would like to Remove them and replace them with the appropriate species. At his own expense.
- Numerous Okame cherry trees throughout the Borough suffered from a late freeze. Shade tree official will keep an eye on these trees.

- Community Forestry Management Plan – It has been received by the State and is under Review. The Plan will be ready to meet the Sustainable Jersey November deadline.
- Arbor Day celebration – Good turn out to support the event.
