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# Overview of Public Health Services in Hightstown Borough

Public Health Services are provided to Hightstown Borough through a municipal shared services agreement with West Windsor Township. The Department is governed by the Public Health Practice Standards of Performance for Local Boards of Health in New Jersey, N.J.A.C. 8:52 and provides services which are locally appropriate to the community. The Health Department is administered the Health Officer supported by the Public Health Nurse, Manager of Environmental Health Services and several Registered Environmental Health Specialists. Contractual employees include a Health Educator and the Clinic Physician. The Health Department provides full time coverage to the community and is available for emergency response 24 hours per day, 7 days a week.

The Department is located at 271Clarksville Road in West Windsor Township. The Health Officer and inspectors are available for onsite inspections, meetings, and conferences within the Borough on a routine basis. The Public Health Nurse maintains office hours three days a week at the Hightstown Housing Authority Administration Office at 131 Rogers Avenue, Hightstown and is available on the remaining two days via telephone or by appointment. Each member of the professional staff is licensed by the State of New Jersey and required to maintain annual continuing education credits in public health topics.

The Health Department is accountable directly to the Board of Health and Borough Administration. Hightstown's Board is an autonomous Board of Health composed from representatives of the community who serve as volunteers. Members are appointed by the Mayor with advice and consent of Council. The Board of Health makes policy decisions, appoints staff, reviews reports prepared by the professional staff and passes ordinances which are deemed necessary to protect the health of the community. Board of Health meetings are open public meetings and are scheduled periodically throughout the year at a local setting.

# RETAIL FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

The retail food program monitors food safety and sanitation at local restaurants, schools, markets and churches to ensure food safety and prevent incidence of foodborne illnesses. Routine inspections are conducted annually at all Retail Food Establishments for compliance with Chapter 24 of the New Jersey State Sanitary Code. Follow-up inspections are performed if critical violations are found the initial inspection. Establishment serving vulnerable populations or engaging in higher risk food preparation are inspected twice a year. Inspectors also investigate consumer complaints related to food establishments. The Health Department also conducts site visits in response to product recalls, power outages, emergency events, and to provide educational materials to operators.

Designs for new establishments and plans for renovations to existing businesses are reviewed to ensure compliance with rules and regulations. Inspections are conducted prior to opening and shortly after to audit the operational food safety practices. Design reviews involve close coordination with the Borough Construction Official.

The Department also regulates and advises Temporary Retail Food Establishments and special events organizers to ensure food safety principles are observed and enforced at fairs, community events and fund raisers. Site inspections are conducted based on potential risks associated with the event.

# **ENVIRONMENTAL/PUBLIC HEALTH ISSUES**

### **PUBLIC RECREATIONAL BATHING PLACES**

Inspections are conducted of all Public Recreational Bathing Places on an annual basis for compliance with Chapter IX of the New Jersey State Sanitary Code. Seasonal facilities are inspected prior to opening for the season and again during the operational season. Year-round facilities are inspected while operational. Additionally, laboratory water analysis results are reviewed on a weekly basis. New facilities and renovations to existing facilities are required to submit plans for review and approval.

# **YOUTH CAMPS**

## **RABIES CONTROL**

The Department hosts and promotes free rabies vaccination clinics for dogs and cats 4 times per year which are open to Borough residents. The December clinic is held locally in Hightstown Borough, while the remaining three are offered in our nearby communities. Rabies education efforts are ongoing throughout the year. The Department also conducts exposure investigation and educational activities. Consultations regarding animal issues are provided to Borough Officials, volunteers, animal control and the residents.

### **PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING ACTIVITIES**

#### **COMMUNICABLE DISEASES**

### Reportable Diseases

Communicable diseases are reported to the local health department by physicians, laboratories, hospitals, schools and institutions in accordance with the parameters set forth in the New Jersey Administrative Code, Title 8, Chapter 57. The health department conducts a case investigation; institutes follow-up activities and reports those which meet the "case definition" as described by the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services. The State of New Jersey has implemented a web-based system for reporting which facilitates information sharing between entities. This service provided by the Public Health Nurse helps to prevent the spread of disease by ensuring that residents are followed and counseled re: testing, treatment and medical supervision.

# Immunization Monitoring

The Child Health Clinic is a joint program sponsored by Hightstown Borough, East Windsor and West Windsor Townships. Children without health insurance receive immunizations, physicals, and developmental screenings and lead testing. This clinic is specifically tailored to address the needs of infants and preschool children. The clinic is staffed by contractual medical professionals and the municipal public health nurses. The services include a full physical examination of each child, age appropriate immunizations, periodic hemoglobin, lead screenings, vision, hearing and TB Tests for tuberculosis. At each clinic parents are counseled regarding growth, development, nutrition and safety.

The Public Health Nurse conducts annual immunization audits of all educational institutions and childcare facilities in the Borough for compliance with mandated immunization requirements. During the audit process the Public Health Nurse provides assistance and guidance to ensure compliance to the State Immunization Requirements. The compliance rate continues to be 98-100%. The nurse continues to work closely with facility directors to ensure consistent implementation of these policies.

# <u>Improved Pregnancy Outcome</u>

The Health Department receives referrals from various sources within the medical community for women in need of prenatal and postpartum services and referrals. In addition, the community nurse conducts home visits at the request of residents for new moms and newborns living in the Borough.

#### ADULT HEALTH

Community nursing provides periodic health screenings for adults at public events such as health fairs and Senior Center programs. The Public Health Nurse provides monthly blood pressure screening to seniors who attend the Senior Center Programs. At the annual R.I.S.E. Health Fair the Public Health Nurse provides health information and screenings as well as referrals to a variety of health services available in the community. Home visits are conducted for homebound residents upon physician referral. Social service visits are conducted on an as-needed basis and are a result both of referrals within the community and the medical system. Annual influenza and pneumococcal vaccinations are offered at the Senior Center.

# **Vital Statistics**

The Registrar of Vital Statistics maintains records of all the marriages, domestic partnerships, civil unions, births and deaths, which occur in Hightstown Borough. The Registrar and Deputy Registrar issue permits for burials, marriage licenses and certified copies of vital records. Historically, the Board of Health has appointed the Borough Clerk to serve as Registrar.
