For more detail, please contact the Public Works Department. The 65 gallon or the 95 gallon blue carts are the only carts accepted. They are to be placed curbside before 7:00 A.M. on the day of collection but not before 5:00 P.M. on the night prior to collection. Follow arrows on the cart for correct placement. All containers must be removed by 8:00 P.M. on the day that the garbage is collected.

WHITE GOODS, APPLIANCES, OUTDOOR GRILLS, METAL OBJECTS:

Major appliances and large bulky metal items, including stoves, washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers, hot water heaters, metal beds and the metal portion of sleep sofas, will be collected by the Borough on the 1st Wednesday of each month **by appointment** only, provided that each item to be disposed of has a Waste Disposal Sticker attached. No metal item will be collected without a sticker attached. One sticker is required for each item to be placed for collection.

No refrigerator, freezer or airtight compartment units can be placed curbside until all doors and/or closures have been removed from the hinges. We also require all freon be removed by an authorized contractor. The Borough requests a copy of the receipt confirming all freon has been removed with the contractor's license number listed on it. Other options would be to contact Mercer Wrecking (609-394-9494) or Beacon Metals (732-462-0543) for disposal of these items.

FURNITURE AND ODDS & ENDS, HOUSEHOLD JUNK:

Acceptable bulk is collected the last Monday of each month **by appointment only**, provided that each item to be disposed of has a Waste Disposal Sticker attached. No bulky item will be collected without a sticker attached. One sticker is required for each item to be placed for collection.

Carpeting must be cut into 36" widths, rolled and tied into bundles not heavier than 45 pounds. Bundles of identical carpeting shall be considered one item and shall require on Waste Disposal Sticker to be placed on one of the bundles.

Fluorescent light tubes can be brought to the Public Works Office and placed in the Blue Garbage Cart on the Mechanic St. side of the Public Works Building or be taken to the Mercer County Hazardous Waste Collection Day held several times per year. CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS/WOOD/SHEET ROCK/DOORS/WINDOWS

Small amounts of construction debris will be collected only to the extent that the debris is contained **entirely** within the container provided by the Borough. The Borough has the right to refuse collection of any Borough provided container that holds more than a small amount.

Mercer Group/Mercer Wrecking will accept construction debris from private citizens at their Trenton facility, located at 1519 Calhoun St., Trenton. They will not accept tires or fiberglass. Please call 609-393-4834 for current pricing, hours of operation and directions.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

Placement of the following items for collection is prohibited: explosive, highly flammable materials or hazardous waste, including but not limited to benzene, gasoline and other petroleum by-products, explosive powders, fluorescent light tubes and bulbs, chlorinated solvents, pesticides, herbicides and other hazardous materials; vehicles; tires; vehicle batteries; auto and truck bodies or parts; construction debris (except as noted above); scrap wood; tiles; wallboard; fencing; decking; computer equipment; oil-based paint; or latex paint in liquid form.

PAINT/HAZARDOUS WASTE

Latex paint cans must be dried and empty. They will be collected with bulk on the last Monday of the month **by appointment only**. All cans must be placed at your curb with the lids off. Any can that is not empty and dry will not be collected. To dry them, open up all cans, let them dry out, you can also use kitty litter to assist in the absorption. Once the latex paint is dry, it will dry into a clump. This clump when dry is non-hazardous and can be placed in your regular trash.

Oil paint and all other hazardous waste must be disposed of at the Mercer County sponsored Hazardous Waste Clean Up held several times per year. For more information on this program, please contact 609-278-8086 or log onto their website at www.mcia-nj.com/recyclinghazwastedisposal.

*****NOTE: The Borough has experienced a high incidence of some residents placing full or partially full paint cans in their garbage, causing the paint to drip out of the***

truck onto the roadway after the garbage is compacted. Effective immediately, residents who do not comply with the regulations of paint disposal will be responsible for the cost of the road cleanup.

BRANCHES, LIMBS (NO THICKER THAN 10" IN DIAMETER):

Branches are chipped curbside each Wednesday **by appointment only**. Please place curbside prior to 8:00 A.M. Stumps or limbs larger than 10" in diameter will be the homeowner's responsibility to dispose of.

GENERAL YARD DEBRIS, RAKINGS, STICKS, TWIGS, STICKER BALLS, WEEDS WITH SOD, BUSH TRIMMINGS TOO SMALL FOR CHIPPER:

Collected **by appointment only** every Tuesday between April and October. Yard waste must be in open containers. This does not include grass and leaves. Please place curbside prior to 8:00 A.M.

LEAVES (NO STICKS OR OTHER DEBRIS):

FALL: Collected by posted schedule and instructions. Schedule is subject to change. Residents of Rte. 33, bagged leaves collected **by appointment only**.

SPRING: Call for instructions. Schedule is subject to change.

GRASS CUTTINGS:

Grass must be placed in biodegradable compost bags **purchased from the Borough**. They are to be placed curbside on Mondays between April 15th and October 15th for collection. No appointment is necessary. The biodegradable compost bags can be bought for \$2.50 each at the Public Works Office or the Borough Clerk's office. The price of the bags includes the Borough's disposal costs.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD:

Boxes will be picked up on recycling days – Boxes need to be cut into 3' square pieces and bundled. If corrugated is contaminated with food, paint, soap, etc., put in regular garbage.

USED MOTOR OIL/ANTIFREEZE:

Drop off center at end of Borough Hall, 148 N. Main Street between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Pour into appropriate tank.

DRY CELL BATTERIES:

Place in regular garbage. The MCIA has ceased their battery recycling program.

USED ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT:

Used computer equipment, printers, fax machines, printers and copiers can now be brought to the Public Works office for disposal. Televisions, VCR players, DVD players, etc., **must** be taken to the Mercer County sponsored Hazardous Waste Clean Up Days held in the spring and the fall. RECYCLING PROGRAM
PICKUP EVERY OTHER WEDNESDAY

Effective August 1, 2008, All recyclable items except corrugated cardboard may be placed in any 33 gallon container for collection as we have changed to a “Single Stream” collection. Recyclables will be separated by machines.

These items include:

Juice bottles & cans
Soda bottles
Baby food jars
Vegetable cans
Liquor & beer bottles
Fruit jars & cans
 Coffee cans & jars
 Pet food cans
 Milk & water jugs
 Milk & juice cartons

Glass salad oil bottles
Soda & beer cans
Pickle & olive jars
Soup cans
Glass ketchup bottles
Tuna fish cans
Glass peanut butter jars
Spaghetti sauce jars
Detergent, bleach, fabric softener containers

Newspaper and associated inserts
Magazines, catalogs and junk mail
Office paper

Coated folding box-board including cereal, cracker, dry soap, beverage carrier and shoe boxes
Kraft paper, including corrugated cardboard, paper bags and sacks

Corrugated Cardboard should be placed in bundles at curbside.

We will now also take #3 and #4 containers in addition to envelopes with windows.

Food containers and cans must be *emptied and rinsed or washed out*. Detergent, bleach and fabric softener bottles must be double rinsed, remove all tops, leave labels.
