Every day, public health staff works to strengthen the community by preventing illnesses, injuries and improving health. The Borough of Hightstown employs a community health nurse and contracts with West Windsor Health Department to provide full-time public health services. The office can be reached at 609-936-8400.

Examples of Services

- CONSUMER HEALTH: inspections of restaurants, schools/daycare, public pools, massage establishments, lead paint hazards, and nuisance properties
- COMMUNICABLE DISEASE: investigations of illnesses and initiation of
 control measures to prevent outbreaks; daily monitoring of patients with
 infectious tuberculosis; seasonal flu vaccines to adults over 55 years of age;
 immunization audits of childcares and schools; rabies investigations/
 vaccination clinics and community education outreach to prevent illnesses
- EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS: planning with emergency management officials and engaging the public to enhance community resiliency to natural disasters, outbreaks or manmade threats; exercising emergency plans
- MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH: Child Health Conference (CHC) for under/uninsured children offering free physical exams, vaccines, TB screenings; referrals to partner resources; and educational consultations
- HEALTH EDUCATION AND SCREENINGS: educational programs on a
 variety of topics are provided to schools, daycares, community sites and upon
 request from groups; blood pressure screenings offered by community nurse
 twice a month at local sites; and preventative health screenings are promoted
 periodically through partnership with healthcare providers
- **CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTION:** radon awareness and test kits available free of charge, smoke-free air policies enforced; tobacco age of sale inspections and education
- LINKING RESIDENTS TO AVAILABLE RESOURCES: The Health
 Department staff work continuously to expand our partnerships within the
 greater Mercer area to identify and promote free/low cost health and safety
 resources available to our residents.
