DISCUSSION

- Review/discuss project plan for Springcrest, Taylor Avenue, Glen Road and Spruce Court. – **Guests: Carmela Roberts and Cameron Corini. Project must be approved by Council in December in order to bid out by the deadline for the grant in January.**
 - **Springcrest: The Committee recommended adding a bicycle facility on the road. The engineering team will review the possibilities for advisory bike lanes or full bike lanes and incorporate an appropriate solution into the plan.**

- **Taylor Avenue:** reviewed the options prepared by the Borough Engineer and recommended options 2 or 3. The preference was to support option 3 with more pavement at the western end if it allowed for at least some vehicles to turn around more easily. **Note:** After the meeting Carmela Roberts reported that it allowed a snow plow to turn around more easily, but did not solve the problem of the garbage truck.
- **Carmela reported on the need to replace the water main on Taylor, because it has reached the end of its' life expectancy.**
- **The Committee discussed the possibility of getting a flashing crosswalk signal at Springcrest and South Main. Bev will reach out to the County planners.**

OLD BUSINESS

- Steve and Joe reported that the Mercer County Planning Board approved the rug mill redevelopment plan with a condition that the developer set aside a \$50,000 cash bond to address post-build changes to address increased traffic.
- Bev reported that the Mobility Plan will be presented to the Planning Board on December 14.
