Dear Mayor and Council:

The New Jersey Department of Transportation has notified the Borough through its Project Management and Reporting System (PMRS) that it has been awarded funding through the Municipal Aid Program for Improvements to Orchard Avenue, Meadow Drive, Clover Lane, and South Main Street in the amount of \$500,000.00.

You may recall that the estimated construction cost was \$1,165,000.00. The awarded allotment is \$665,000.00 less than the requested amount. This cost does not include the costs for water and sewer improvements.

The proposed improvements are as follows:

Roadway Improvements (\$1,165,000.00)

- Repaving of Orchard Avenue, Meadow Drive, and Clover Lane with an estimate cost of approximately \$645,000.00.
- Curb replacement as necessary and new sidewalks on one side of Orchard Avenue, Meadow Drive, Clover Lane, and South Main Street with an estimated cost of approximately \$395,000.00.
- Stormwater, signage, and striping improvements as required with an estimated cost of approximately \$125,000.00.

As the total estimated cost is \$665,000.00 less than the requested amount, we have evaluated ways to reduce the overall construction cost. However, please note that the paving, stormwater, signage, and striping improvements noted above are required and have an estimated cost of \$770,000.00. We may be able to reduce costs by eliminating new sidewalks on Meadow Drive and Clover Lane. This will reduce the cost for these improvements by \$170,000 from \$395,000.00 to approximately \$225,000.00.

If the Borough does not wish to reduce the scope of work, a low interest loan through the NJ Transportation Infrastructure Bank to fund the improvements above the grant amount is available. This process would be similar to the loan funding obtained for water improvements on past projects.

#### Water Improvements (\$307,000.00)

The existing 6" water main on Orchard Avenue between Schuyler Avenue and the southern intersection with Meadow Drive is undersized and must be replaced with an 8" water main to improve fire flow. This cost is approximately \$307,000.00.

- The Borough Water Department has recently inspected the existing water services in accordance with recent NJDEP requirements regarding lead service evaluation. The Water Department found that all water services within the project area (public and private) are copper and therefore do not require replacement.
- The Borough can apply for a low interest loan through the NJ Water Infrastructure Bank to fund these improvements as has been done for water improvements over the past decade.

#### Sewer Improvements (\$200,000.00)

- During inspections of the existing water services, the Borough Water Department found that sanitary sewer laterals are made of Orangeburg pipe. The Borough has had a policy of replacing Orangeburg laterals when encountered as they are typically in poor condition and do not have extended lifespans. This cost is approximately \$200,000.00.
- There is no apparent evidence of problems with the existing sanitary sewer main. However, I defer to the AWWTP Superintendent to verify that no sewer main improvements are necessary.

As outlined above, the total estimated cost for all improvements is \$1,672,000.00. Roberts Engineering Group is prepared to move forward with the contract.

The anticipated costs for survey, design, permitting, bidding, and construction administration/inspection are as follows:

Survey, Design, Permitting, Bidding, Loan Applications $=$	\$ 87,000.00
Construction Administration and Inspection =	<u>\$ 98,000.00</u>
TOTAL =	\$185,000.00

# ORDINANCE 2022-05

BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN COUNTY OF MERCER STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 25, "STORMWATER CONTROL" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN

**WHEREAS,** the Borough of Hightstown maintains a Tier A MS4 New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NJPDES) Stormwater Permit; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough is required to develop, update, implement, and enforce a program to ensure adequate long-term cleaning, operation, and maintenance of stormwater facilities not owned or operated by the Borough; and

**WHEREAS**, at the recommendation of the Borough Engineer, and in order to remain in compliance with the Stormwater Permit, the Hightstown Borough Council has agreed to modify the existing language of certain provisions currently contained within the Borough Code.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED,** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Hightstown, in the County of Mercer and State of New Jersey, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 25 "Stormwater Control," of the "Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Hightstown," is hereby amended and supplemented in the following respects (additions are shown with <u>underline</u>, deletions are shown with <del>strikeout</del>):

#### 25-1-11 Requirements Regarding Dumpsters and Other Refuse Containers

A. Purpose

This Section requires dumpsters and other refuse containers that are outdoors or exposed to stormwater to be covered at all times and prohibits the spilling, dumping, leaking, or otherwise discharge of liquids, semi-liquids or solids from the containers to the municipal separate storm sewer system(s) operated by the Borough of Hightstown and/or the waters of the State so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for the failure to comply.

B. Definitions

For the purpose of this Section, the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

<u>1. Municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) – a conveyance or system of conveyances (including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins,</u>

curbs, gutters, ditches, manmade channels, or storm drains) that is owned or operated by Hightstown Borough or other public body, and is designed and used for collecting and conveying stormwater.

- 2. Person any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.
- 3. Refuse container any waste container that a person controls whether owned, leased, or operated, including dumpsters, trash cans, garbage pails, and plastic trash bags.
- 4. Stormwater means water resulting from precipitation (including rain and snow) that runs off the land's surface, is transmitted to the subsurface, is captured by separate storm sewers or other sewerage or drainage facilities, or is conveyed by snow removal equipment.
- 5. Waters of the State means the ocean and its estuaries, all springs, streams and bodies of surface or ground water, whether natural or artificial, within the boundaries of the State of New Jersey or subject to its jurisdiction.

#### C. Applicability

- 1. Any person who controls, whether owned, leased, or operated, a refuse container or dumpster must ensure that such container or dumpster is covered at all times and shall prevent refuse from spilling out or overflowing.
- 2. Any person who owns, leases or otherwise uses a refuse container or dumpster must ensure that such container or dumpster does not leak or otherwise discharge liquids, semi-liquids or solids to the municipal separate storm sewer system(s) operated by the Borough of Hightstown.

#### D. Exceptions

- 1. Permitted temporary demolition containers
- 2. Litter receptacles (other than dumpsters or other bulk containers)
- 3. Individual homeowner trash and recycling containers
- 4. Refuse containers at facilities authorized to discharge stormwater under a valid NJPDES permit
- 5. Large bulky items (e.g., furniture, bound carpet and padding, white goods placed curbside for pickup)
- E. Enforcement and Penalties
  - 1. This Section shall be enforced by the Stormwater Management Coordinator and/or Superintendent of the Department of Public Works and/or their designee of the Borough of Hightstown.
  - 2. Any person who is found to be in violation of this Section shall be subject to penalties as stated in Chapter 1, Article 1-5 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Hightstown.

#### 25—1-1112. Penalties

Any person(s) who erects, constructs, alters, repairs, converts, maintains, or uses any building, structure or land in violation of this ordinance shall be subject to the following penalties: Chapter 1, Article 1-5 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Hightstown.

#### 25-1-1213. Severability

Each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or holding of any such portion of this Ordinance to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 2.</u> In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to that portion of the Ordinance actually adjudged to be invalid, and the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable therefrom and shall not be affected.

Section 3. All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon final passage and publication in accordance with the law.

#### AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CERTAIN NEW REGULATIONS CONCERNING VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, AND AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 7, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC," OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN, NEW JERSEY

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hightstown (the "Borough") wish to establish certain new regulations concerning vehicles and traffic within the Borough; and

**WHEREAS,** the new regulations will prohibit vehicles which have a gross vehicle registered weight in excess of four (4) tons from operating on all municipal owned streets, except for those streets specifically identified by the Borough or as otherwise provided by the Borough; and

**WHEREAS,** the new regulations will also prohibit vehicles from turning at the intersection of North Main Street and Wyckoff Mills Road, when traveling in a northbound or southbound direction on North Main Street; and

**WHEREAS,** the Mayor and Council believe that these new regulations will improve traffic flow in the Borough, and that the regulations are in furtherance of the health, safety and welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, in order to codify these new regulations, the Mayor and Council wish to make certain changes to Chapter 7, entitled "Traffic," of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Hightstown, New Jersey, as set forth below.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED,** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hightstown as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. That vehicles which have a gross vehicle registered weight in excess of four (4) tons are hereby prohibited from operating on all municipal owned streets, except for those streets specifically identified by Ordinance by the Borough or as otherwise provided by the Borough.

<u>Section 2</u>. That all vehicles are hereby prohibited from turning at the intersection of North Main Street and Wyckoff Mills Road, when traveling in a northbound or southbound direction on North Main Street

<u>Section 3.</u> That all relevant Borough officials and/or employees are hereby authorized and directed to undertake all actions that are necessary to implement the aforesaid new traffic regulations, including but not limited to the posting of appropriate signage and/or other markings to alert the public, as well as to seek any approvals which may be necessary from any other governmental agencies or authorities which may have jurisdiction over the matters set forth in the within Ordinance.

Section 4. That Chapter 7, entitled "Traffic", of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Hightstown, New Jersey, is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows (underline for additions, strikethroughs for deletions):

§ 7-1-18 Truck Route System. [Ord. No. 1-16-92] A truck route system upon which trucks in excess of four tons gross weight may travel is hereby established on the following streets or parts of streets:

Name of Street	Location
Etra Road (C.R. 571)	From South Main Street to the East Windsor Township corporate line
North Main Street (C.R. 539)	Within the Borough corporate line
Rogers Avenue	Entire length
South Main Street (C.R. 539)	Within the Borough corporate line
Stockton Street (C.R. 571)	From the Township of East Windsor corporate line to Rogers Avenue
West Ward Street	From South Main Street (CR 539 — 571 to Mercer Street (Route 33)

All vehicles having a gross vehicle registered weight in excess of four (4) tons shall be excluded from all municipal owned streets, except for the specific municipal streets identified above. Such vehicles shall, however, be permitted on all streets for the purpose of the local pickup and delivery of materials only. Exempt vehicles include all Borough-owned vehicles, school buses, and recycling trucks.

#### § 7-1-23 Turn Prohibitions.

No person shall make a turn at any location listed and only in the manner described.

<u>Section-5.</u> That all other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>Section 6.</u> That this Ordinance shall become effective upon final passage and publication in accordance with the law, following the receipt of any approvals deemed necessary by any other governmental agencies or authorities which may have jurisdiction over the matters set forth in the within Ordinance and the installation of proper signage by the Borough of Hightstown and/or the County of Mercer.

## Ordinance 2022-07

BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN COUNTY OF MERCER STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE WATER-SEWER UTILITY IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF MERCER, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$1,100,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,100,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE THE COST THEREOF.

**BE IT ORDAINED** BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN, IN THE COUNTY OF MERCER, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Hightstown, in the County of Mercer, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,100,000. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c), no down payment is provided for the costs of the improvement since the project described in Section 3(a) hereof is expected to be funded through the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank.

. Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,100,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is water tank painting and repairs for the water-sewer utility, including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 15 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,100,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$65,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.

Section 7. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3(a) hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with

the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 7 ENTITLED "TRAFFIC", ARTICLE 7-1-14 ENTITLED "PARKING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES ON CERTAIN STREETS" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended that changes to be made to restrict parking on Cranbury Station Road; and

WHEREAS, said changes would be to prohibit parking on both sides of Cranbury Station Road from Monmouth Street to Wycoff Mills Road; and

WHEREAS, Mayor and Council agree with said recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hightstown as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. That Chapter 7, entitled "Traffic", Article 7-1-14, entitled "Parking Prohibited at all Times on Certain Streets)", is hereby amended to read as follows (underline for additions, strikethroughs for deletions):

## AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT WITH COMMUNITY ACTION SERVICE CENTER, INC., d/b/a RISE, RELATING TO THE UTILIZATION OF MUNICIPAL GARBAGE DUMPSTERS LOCATED IN THE STOCKTON STREET PARKING LOT

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Hightstown (the "Borough") and Community Action Service Center, Inc., d/b/a RISE (hereinafter referred to as "RISE") have agreed that RISE shall be entitled to utilize the municipal garbage dumpsters located in the Stockton Street Parking Lot, pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Hightstown, in the County of Mercer and State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. That the Borough Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute, and the Clerk to attest, the attached Agreement with RISE.
- 2. That a certified copy of this Resolution and the attached Agreement shall be provided to each of the following:
  - a. Community Action Service Center, Inc., d/b/a RISE;
  - b. Dimitri Musing, Borough Administrator; and
  - c. Frederick C. Raffetto, Esq., Borough Attorney.

Margaret Riggio Borough Clerk **BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN,** a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, with offices located at 156 Bank Street, Hightstown, New Jersey 08520 (hereinafter referred to as the "Borough");

and

**Community Action Service Center, Inc., d/b/a RISE**, a New Jersey non-profit corporation, having an address of 116 North Main Street, Hightstown, New Jersey 08520 (hereinafter referred to as the "Business Establishment").

(Collectively, the Borough and the Business Establishment shall be referred to herein as the "Parties").

**WHEREAS,** the Parties have agreed that the Business Establishment shall be entitled to utilize the municipal garbage dumpsters (the "dumpsters") located in the Stockton Street Parking Lot pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the within Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, it is hereby agreed by and between the Parties as follows:

1. The Borough hereby agrees to provide solid waste collection service to the Business Establishment from a dumpster-style garbage container located in the Stockton Street municipal parking lot.

2. The Borough hereby agrees to provide to the Business Establishment collection of corrugated cardboard for recycling from a dumpster-style cardboard recycling container located in the Stockton Street municipal parking lot.

3. The Business Establishment shall not place in the dumpster-style garbage container any recyclable materials. All recyclable materials shall be properly disposed of in accordance with Chapter 18 of the Code of the Borough of Hightstown.

4. The Business Establishment shall flatten all corrugated cardboard boxes prior to placing them into the dumpster-style cardboard recycling container.

5. Due to the anticipated volume of refuse associated with the Business Establishment, and in order to ensure cleanliness and to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public, the Parties have agreed that an additional pick-up day is required beyond that which would have otherwise been necessary prior to the execution of the within Agreement in order to accommodate the Business Establishment (i.e., 4 pick-ups per week will occur instead of 3 pick-ups per week). The Parties have agreed that the Business Establishment shall be required to pay

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the costs associated with the additional pick-up day. As of the execution of the within Agreement, the Parties recognize that this cost equates to \$498.33 per month (the "fee"); however, the Parties also recognize that the fee may be adjusted over time. The Borough shall advise the Business Establishment on an annual basis as to the fee for that year, and the Business Establishment agrees to pay the fee in order to be eligible to continue to utilize the dumpsters. The payment of the fee shall be due within 25 days of receipt from the Borough of an invoice therefor.

6. If the Business Establishment shall fail to pay to the Borough the monthly fee for the solid waste collection service within thirty (30) days of the due date, the outstanding fees shall accrue interest at the rate(s) set by Resolution of Council for interest on delinquent taxes and other assessments and shall constitute a lien against the property of the Business Establishment, and such costs shall be added to and become a part of the taxes next to be assessed and levied upon such lands. Additionally, the Borough shall cease the services authorized under this Agreement until full restitution has been made to the Borough for such outstanding fees.

7. The Business Establishment hereby agrees to release, defend, indemnify and hold the Borough harmless from and against any and all losses, liabilities, suits, judgments, and demands associated with the Borough's provision of solid waste collection service as contemplated herein.

8. The Business Establishment shall comply with all provisions of Chapter 18 of the Code of the Borough of Hightstown governing solid waste management.

9. This Agreement shall have a term extending through December 31, 2022. Thereafter, this Agreement shall be automatically renewable for one year terms commencing as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the given year, unless the either party gives a minimum of sixty (60) days notice of its intention not to renew the contract prior to the annual renewal date of this Agreement.

10. This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the rights of the parties hereto and shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

11. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding and agreement between the parties and shall not be modified or amended except by an instrument in writing executed by both parties.

12. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties and their legal representatives, successors and assigns.

#### **Summer Hours Summary**

- Summer hours start July 1 and ends September 6.
- Borough office remains open 5 days a week. Each department will schedule the days off so that there is always someone in the office who can handle the Borough business.
- Instead of a one hour lunch, lunch is half an hour and the other half hour is worked through to accumulate as comp hours. This half hour is noted on a timesheet and kept track of by the payroll department as has been done in the past.
- The time period to accumulate hours is from May 1 to November 18. People taking vacation time during the summer hours period will continue to work the half hour during the lunch time until the summer hours are made up.
- Summer hours are optional for employees who wish to participate in it.
- Benefits:
  - Summer hours can boost employees' productivity, morale, and loyalty while reducing absenteeism.
  - Summer hours help retain employees as an added benefit.
  - Summer hours are a benefit which does not cost Hightstown anything.
  - Summer hours help employees with children, who uses grandparents for child care during the summer, to relieve the grandparents, one day a week.
  - Allows employees the opportunity to schedule their work around planned vacations and time away from the office
