ORDINANCE 2022-18

BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN COUNTY OF MERCER STATE OF NEW JERSEY

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE REPLACEMENT OF LEAD AND GALVANIZED SERVICE LINES AND AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 19, ENTITLED "WATER AND SEWER," OF "THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN" IN ORDER TO ESTABLISH A NEW ARTICLE 19-6 THEREOF TO BE KNOWN AS "REPLACEMENT OF LEAD AND GALVANIZED SERVICE LINES"

WHEREAS, the presence of lead in drinking water represents a threat to the public health, especially the health and development of New Jersey's children; and

WHEREAS, pipes containing lead that connect water mains to homes and other buildings, often called lead service lines, are a primary source of lead in drinking water; and

WHEREAS, given the risk to public health, the New Jersey State Legislature has required that each public water system replace all existing lead and galvanized service lines, including those existing on private property; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect the health and welfare of the citizens of the Borough of Hightstown, in the County of Mercer, and State of New Jersey (hereinafter the "Borough"), the Borough's Mayor and Council implemented an inventory and replacement plan for any lead and galvanized service lines existing within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, to effectuate said plan, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 58:12A-39, the Borough hereby adopts this Ordinance to allow the Borough and/or the Borough's water system, including any officials, employees and/or agents thereof, to enter any property within the Borough to perform lead and galvanized service line replacements, provided that the Borough serves appropriate notices upon the proper parties, as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, on June 20, 2022, the Borough's Mayor and Council adopted Resolution No. 2022-120, which established the official policy of the Borough relative to funding the costs associated with lead and galvanized service line replacements; specifically, the costs associated with lead/galvanized service line replacements shall be borne by all of the customers of the Borough-owned public community water system, rather than assessed to the property of specific property owners in the same manner as provided for the assessment of local improvements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:56-1, *et seq.* Said determination was made in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:12A-44(e).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Hightstown, in the County of Mercer and State of New Jersey, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 19, entitled "Water and Sewer," of "The Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Hightstown" (the "Borough Code"), is hereby amended and supplemented in certain limited respects, in order to establish a new Article 19-6, to be known as "Replacement of Lead and Galvanized Service Lines," to read as follows:

Article 19-6. Replacement of Lead and Galvanized Service Lines.

§ 19-6-1. Purpose and Authority.

The Borough finds that the presence of lead in drinking water represents a threat to the public health and welfare of its citizens, and that pipes containing lead that connect water mains to homes and other buildings, called lead or galvanized service lines, are significant sources of lead in drinking water. As such, under the authority granted the Borough by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 58:12A-38 and <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 58:12A-39, the Borough hereby declares its intent to identify and replace all lead and/or galvanized service lines within the Borough, including the authority to enter upon any property within the Borough to replace all existing lead and/or galvanized service lines, at the Borough's cost and expense.

§ 19-6-2. Scope of Property Owner/Borough Responsibilities.

- A. This Chapter shall generally govern the respective responsibilities of the Borough and individual property owners as to all service lines within the Borough, except in the case of a "lead service line" to which this Article 19-6 shall specifically be applicable.
- B. A "lead service line" is a water supply connection that is made of, or lined with, a material consisting of lead, and which connects a water main to a building inlet. A lead pigtail, lead gooseneck, or other lead fitting shall be considered to be a lead service line, regardless of the composition of the service line or other portions of piping to which such piece is attached. A galvanized service line shall be considered to be a lead service line. A lead service line may be owned by the Borough, a property owner, or both.
- C. In the case of a "lead service line", the Borough shall be responsible for replacement of all pipes, tubing, and fittings connecting its water main to a building or structure, including the water meter for the property. Pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 52:12A-44(e), the Borough has determined that all costs and expenses associated with the said replacement work shall be funded by the Borough, rather than assessed to specific property owner(s).

§ 19-6-3. Borough's Right-of-Entry to Replace Lead Service Lines.

The Borough shall have the authority to enter any property within the Borough to perform a lead service line replacement, provided that the Borough provides the owner and any residents of the property with notice at least 72 hours before entering the property, unless in the case of an emergency as determined by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

A. For the purposes of this Subsection 19-6-3, notice to the owner and any residents of the property shall include an attempt to inform the owner and any residents in person of the

date and time of the lead service line replacement, and if the owner or a resident is unable to be reached in person, the Borough shall send, by certified mail, a letter to the owner and any residents or post a written notice in a prominent location on the property which shall include:

- (1) The scheduled date and time of the lead service line replacement and who will be performing the replacement;
- (2) The likely extent of water service disruption;
- (3) The nearby locations where the municipality or a public water system is distributing supplementary drinking water, if any; and
- (4) Any remedies that the municipality shall take if the municipality or municipal water system, or an agent thereof, is unable to access the property.
- B. In addition to the notice requirements set forth in this Subsection 19-6-3, the Borough shall send, by certified mail, the owner a letter after the completion of the replacement stating the approximate time that the replacement occurred, and providing a brief summary of the work performed.

Section 2. All parts and provisions of any Ordinance which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>Section 3.</u> The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to the portion of the Ordinance actually adjudged invalid and shall not be deemed to affect the operation of any other portion thereof, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with the law.

WHEREAS, small municipalities have limited debt capacity and the lead service line mandate will stress that capacity and every resident due to increased water and sewer rates over the next 10 years; and

WHEREAS, Hightstown Borough is requesting that additional funding be added to lead service line replacement particularly for small systems; and

WHEREAS, Hightstown Borough is requesting that the maximum amount of funding and loan forgiveness under the NANO program be substantially increased.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the State of New Jersey Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Programs be modified to provide additional funding to small systems with limited financial resources and therefore limited ability to take on the burden of additional debt and modify its program to increase the funding limit in the NANO program and increase the amount of loan forgiveness.

Dear Mr. Hauch:

I am writing to you as the Administrator of Hightstown Borough, a small Municipality in the State of New Jersey. Hightstown Borough has a population of approximately 5,500 people and provides water and sewer service through Municipally owned departments. Hightstown Borough owns a water distribution system that includes a water treatment plant, three (3) water storage tanks, and a sanitary sewer collection system with one (1) pump station and an advanced wastewater treatment plant that treats water to tertiary standards.

The Borough has made a diligent effort to maintain its water system and to prevent it from experiencing excessive degradation and has never exceeded contaminant limits within its water system.

I am writing to request a modification to how small Municipal systems are treated within the funding system for the revolving loan program. The costs associated with maintaining water and sewer systems are high, as I am sure you know. Small Municipalities, such as Hightstown, are least able to afford the improvements necessary to maintain a safe and reliable treatment system. The program must provide more to support small Municipal systems, such as Hightstown.

We have participated in the NANO Loan Forgiveness Program, but this program maxes out at \$1 million dollars and can only provide up to 50% loan forgiveness or \$500,000.00. We often have improvements costing in excess of \$1 million. An increase in the Nano Loan Forgiveness Program above \$1 million dollars would be incredibly beneficial as it would allow the Borough to take advantage of the cost-benefit of larger construction projects, and the Borough would benefit from a larger amount of principal forgiveness.

We are currently dealing with the State Law requiring all lead service lines, both publicly and privately owned, to be replaced no later than 2031. We are currently aware of at least 800 service lines within Hightstown that are lead, and we expect this number to increase as we have not finished our system inventory. The cost of replacing the lead services may cost the Borough up to \$10 million dollars. This is a burden that is too difficult for a small community to bear. The Borough has limited debt capacity. The lead service line mandate stresses that capacity and places a financial hardship on our residents, as we foresee significantly increased water and sewer rates over the next ten years. We believe that when the ability of a Municipality to make the improvements required by the State is evaluated, all the fees in the Municipality must be considered. Our residents pay taxes, plus water and

sewer fees. The needed increase in rates for the lead service lines is going to be extremely difficult for many of our residents to bear.

This letter is to request that additional funding be added to the lead service line replacement mandate, particularly for small systems. \$1 million dollars per year is inadequate through the NANO Program, as is the 50% loan forgiveness. We need additional funding provided by the State.

When we review the Intended Use Plan, we notice multiple locations throughout the State that are privately owned companies that are receiving millions and tens of millions of dollars. We also notice other locations that have exceeded maximum contaminant levels and are being financed because the needed financial investments to adequately maintain these systems were not undertaken.

We request a new way to evaluate how funding is allocated, and we request an increase in grant funds and loan forgiveness for small Municipal systems.

We do not want to be purchased by a large, privately owned water company. We want to continue providing our residents with exemplary service and clean drinking water.

In summary, small systems are not receiving sufficient funding through the State Revolving Fund Program. Small systems are not receiving adequate loan forgiveness. Small systems cannot take on the debt necessary to meet State requirements, and that inability to take on debt should not be considered a prerequisite for a forced sale to a private water company. We expect that a sale to a private water company will ultimately increase rates for our residents, and we do not consider that an adequate and satisfactory response.

We request that the State of New Jersey Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund programs be modified to provide additional funding to small systems with limited financial resources and, therefore, limited ability to take on the burden of additional debt.

RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE INCREASES TO THE STATE HEALTH BENEFITS PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP), governed by N.J.S.A. 52:14-17.25 et seq., offers medical, prescription drug, and dental coverage to qualified State and participating local government public employees, retirees, and eligible dependents; and

WHEREAS, all SHBP plans are self-funded meaning that the money paid out for benefits comes directly from a SHBP fund supplied by the State, participating local employers, and member premiums; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Pensions and Benefits is responsible for the daily administrative activities of the SHPB, the State Health Benefits Commission is the executive organization responsible for overseeing the SHBP; and

WHEREAS, the State Health Benefits Commission, comprised of state officials and union representatives, annually consider the calendar year premium levels for the Local Government Employer Group of the SHBP based on recommendations found in the Rate Setting Recommendation Analysis of the Local Government Employee Group; and

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2022, the State Health Benefits Commission voted to approve a nearly 23% increase for local government health insurance rates for 2023; and

WHEREAS, the vote for this increase occurred without full consideration of cost-sharing measures offered by members of the Plan Design Committee; and

WHEREAS, it appears that no other state is seeing such a drastic double-digit single year increase in their state and local government health plans; and

WHEREAS, while these costs are outside of the municipal cap, revenue will still have to be identified to cover the increased costs that will be paid for by municipalities, local government employees and property taxpayers

WHEREAS, the premium increase for most active employees will take thousands more out of their paychecks annually and lead to huge costs for local governments that will translate into higher property tax bills and cause a financial hardship for residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hightstown in the county of Mercer call upon the State Health Benefit Commission to reconsider the rate increase by evaluating the cost-sharing measures offered by the Plan Design Committee and strike a rate increase that is appropriate given the current economic conditions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Hightstown in the county of Mercer urge the legislature to adopt legislation expanding the composition of the State Health Benefits Commission to include representatives from both municipal and county government management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Murphy, State Treasurer Muoio, Senate President Scutari, Assembly Speaker Coughlin, Senator Linda Greenstein, Assemblyman Daniel Benson, Assemblyman Wayne DeAngelo, and New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING RENEWAL OF MUNICIPAL CONSENT TO COMCAST OF CENTRAL NEW JERSEY, L.P. TO CONSTRUCT, CONNECT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A CABLE TELEVISION AND COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM IN THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN, MERCER COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN, MERCER COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE OF THE ORDINANCE.

The Borough hereby grants to Comcast of Central New Jersey, L.P. renewal of its non-exclusive Municipal Consent to place in, upon, across, above, over and under highways, streets alleys, sidewalks, easements, public ways and public places in the Borough, poles, wires, cables, underground conduits, manholes and other television conductors, fixtures, apparatus, and equipment as may be necessary for the construction, operation and maintenance in the Borough of a cable television and communications system.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. Such meaning or definition of terms in supplemental to those definitions of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") rules and regulations, 47 <u>C.F.R.</u> Subsection 76.1 <u>et seq</u>., and the Cable Communications Policy Act, 47 <u>U.S.C.</u> Section 521 <u>et seq</u>., as amended, and the Cable Television Act, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> § 48:5A-1 <u>et seq</u>., and shall in no way be construed to broaden, alter or conflict with the federal and state definitions:

- A. "Borough" or "Municipality" is the Borough of Hightstown, County of Mercer, State of New Jersey.
- b. "Company" or "Comcast" is the grantee of rights under this Ordinance and is known as Comcast of Central New Jersey, L.P.
- c. "Act" or "Cable Television Act" is Chapter 186 of the General Laws of New Jersey, and subsequent amendments thereto, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> § 48:5A-1, <u>et seq.</u>
- d. "FCC" is the Federal Communications Commission.
- e. "Board" or 'BPU" is the Board of Public Utilities, State of New Jersey.
- f. "Office" or "OCTV" is the Office of Cable Television of the Board.
- g. "Basic Cable Service" means any service tier, which includes the retransmission of local television broadcast signals as defined by the FCC.

- h. "Application" is the Company's Application for Renewal of Municipal Consent.
- i. "Primary Service Area" or 'PSA" consists of the area of the Borough currently served with existing plant as set forth in the map annexed to the Company's Application for Municipal Consent.

SECTION 3. STATEMENT OF FINDINGS.

A public hearing concerning the consent herein granted to the Company was held after proper public notice pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act and the regulations of the Board adopted pursuant thereto. Said hearing having been held and fully opened to the public, and the Borough, having received at said public hearing all comments regarding the qualifications of the Company to receive this renewal of Municipal Consent, the Borough hereby finds that the Company possesses the necessary legal, technical, character, financial and other qualifications and that the Company's operating and construction arrangements are adequate and feasible.

SECTION 4. DURATION OF FRANCHISE.

The non-exclusive Municipal Consent granted herein shall expire ten (10) years from the date of expiration of the previous Certificate of Approval issued by the Board.

In the event that the Borough shall find that the Company has not substantially complied with the material terms and conditions of this Ordinance, the Borough shall have the right to petition the OCTV, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 48:5A-47, for appropriate action, including modification and/or termination of the Certificate of Approval; provided however, that the Borough shall first have given the Company written notice of all alleged instances of non-compliance and an opportunity to cure same within ninety (90) days of that notification.

SECTION 5. FRANCHISE FEE.

Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act, N.J.S.A. 48:5A-30(d), the Company shall, during each year of operation under the consent granted herein, pay to the Municipality 3.5% of the gross revenues from all recurring charges in the nature of subscription fees paid by subscribers for cable television reception service in the Municipality or any higher amount permitted by the Act or otherwise allowable by law, whichever is greater. The current franchise fee paid to the Borough is 3.5%.

SECTION 6. FRANCHISE TERRITORY.

The consent granted under this Ordinance for the renewal of the franchise shall apply to the entirety of the Borough and any property subsequently annexed hereto.

SECTION 7. EXTENSION OF SERVICE.

The Company shall, during the franchise period, be required to offer service to any present or future dwelling unit, school, institution, and business located and to be located along any public rights-of-way in the primary service area, as set forth in the Company's application. Any extension

of plant beyond the Primary Service Area shall be governed by the Company's Line Extension Policy, as set forth in the Company's Application, with a HPM ("homes-per-mile") of 35 dwellings per linear mile from the nearest active trunk or feeder line from which a usable cable signal may be obtained. For purposes of this section and the Company's implementation of the LEP, a home shall only be counted as a "dwelling unit" if such home is occupied and within two hundred seventy-five (275) feet of the public right of way.

SECTION 8. CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS.

- a. Restoration: In the event that the Company or its agents shall disturb any pavement, street surfaces, sidewalks, driveways, or other surface in the natural topography, the Company shall, at its sole expense, restore and replace such places or things so disturbed in as reasonably good a condition as existed prior to the commencement of said work.
- b. Relocation: If at any time during the period of this consent, the Borough shall alter or change the grade of any street, alley or other way or place the Company, upon reasonable notice by the Borough, shall remove, re-lay or relocate its equipment, at the expense of the Company. In requiring Company to remove, re-lay or relocate any portion of its property, the Borough shall treat Company the same as, and require no more of Company than, any other similarly situated entity utilizing the Public Rights of Way, including with respect to reimbursement of costs.
- c. Removal or Trimming of Trees: During the exercise of its rights and privileges under this franchise, the Company shall have the authority to trim trees upon and overhanging streets, alleys, sidewalks or other public places of the Borough so as to prevent the branches of such trees from coming in contact with the wires and cable of the Company. Such trimming shall be only to the extent necessary to maintain proper clearance of the Company's wire and cables. Except in an emergency, the Company will not, without the prior consent of the Supervisor of the Borough's Department of Public Works, or his/her delegate, trim or remove trees in the public rights-of-way or parks in the Borough. The Supervisor or delegate will respond to a request for authorization within 48 hours, Monday through Friday. If requested, the Company will perform any trimming under the direct supervision of the Supervisor or his designee.
- d. Installation of Equipment: The Company shall install equipment in the same location and manner as existing public utilities whenever possible, in order to minimize the impact of same on surrounding property.
- e. Temporary removal of cables: The Company shall, upon request of the Borough, at the Company's expense, temporarily raise, lower or remove its cables and associated facilities in order to facilitate the moving of Borough-owned buildings, equipment, vehicles and machinery and to accommodate other like circumstances. In light of a temporary removal request by other than the Borough for non-Borough-owned buildings, equipment, vehicles and machinery, the cost of such temporary removal shall be the responsibility of the requesting party.

SECTION 9. CUSTOMER SERVICE.

In providing services to its customers, the Company shall comply with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 14:18-1, <u>et seq</u>. and all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations. The Company shall strive to meet or exceed all voluntary company and industry standards in the delivery of customer service and shall be prepared to report on it to the Borough Council upon written request of the Borough Administrator or Clerk.

- a. The Company shall continue to comply fully with all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations regarding credit for outages, the reporting of same to regulatory agencies and notification of same to customers.
- b. The Company shall continue to fully comply with all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations regarding the availability of devices for the hearing impaired and the notification of same to customers.
- c. The Company shall use every reasonable effort to meet or exceed voluntary standards for telephone accessibility by the National Cable Television Association (NCTA).
- d. Nothing herein shall impair the right of any subscriber or the Borough to express any comment with respect to telephone accessibility to the Complaint Officer, or impair the right of the Complaint Officer to take any action that is permitted under law.

SECTION 10. MUNICIPAL COMPLAINT OFFICER.

The Office of Cable Television is hereby designed as the Complaint Officer for the Municipality pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 48:5A-26(b). All complaints shall be received and processed in accordance with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 14:17-6.5. The Municipality shall have the right to request copies of records and reports pertaining to complaints by Municipality customers from the OCTV.

SECTION 11. LOCAL OFFICE.

During the term of this franchise, and any renewal thereof, the Company shall maintain a business office or agent in accordance with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> § 14:18-5.1 for the purpose of receiving, investigating and resolving all local complaints regarding the quality of service, equipment malfunctions, and similar matters. Such a business office shall have a publicly listed toll-free telephone number and be open during standard business hours, and in no event (excepting emergent circumstances) less than 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday.

SECTION 12. PERFORMANCE BOND.

During the life of the franchise the Company shall give to the Borough a bond in the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000). Such bond shall be to insure the faithful performance of all undertakings of the Company as represented in its application for municipal consent incorporated herein.

SECTION 13. SUBSCRIBER RATES.

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The rates of the Company shall be subject to regulation as permitted by federal and state law.

SECTION 14. COMMITMENTS BY THE COMPANY.

- a. The Company shall continue to provide Basic cable television service to one (1) outlet to each qualified existing school and library in the Borough, public and private, elementary, intermediate and secondary, provided the school building is within one hundred seventy-five (175) feet of active cable distribution plant or through customer owned conduit. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials plus labor basis by the school or library requesting service. Monthly service charges shall be waived on all additional outlets.
- b. The Company shall continue to provide Basic cable television service to one (1) outlet to each qualified municipal building in the Borough (Borough Hall, Police Headquarters, Fire Department, and First Aid building), provided they are within one hundred seventy-five (175) feet of active cable distribution plant or through customer owned conduit. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials plus labor basis by the Borough.
- c. Within six months of the issuance of a Renewal Certificate of Approval by the BPU, the Company shall provide to the Borough a one-time E/G Access Capital Grant in the amount of \$10,000 to meet the Access capital needs of the community.
- d. The Communications Act of 1934, as amended [47 U.S.C. §543 (b)], allows the Company to itemize and/or identify: (1.) the amount on the subscriber bill assessed as a franchise fee and the identity of the governmental authority to which the fee is paid; (2.) the amount on the bill assessed to satisfy any requirements imposed on the Company by the cable franchise to support public, education, and/or governmental access channels or the use of such channels; and (3.) any grants or other fees on the bill or any tax, assessment, or charge of any kind imposed by any governmental authority on the transaction between the operator and the subscriber. The Company reserves its external cost, pass-through rights to the full extent permitted by law.

SECTION 15. EMERGENCY USES.

a. The Company will comply with the Emergency Alert System ("EAS") rules in accordance with applicable state and federal statutes and regulations.

b. The Company shall in no way be held liable for any injury suffered by the Borough or any other person, during an emergency, if for any reason the Borough is unable to make full use of the cable television system as contemplated herein.

SECTION 16. LIABILITY INSURANCE.

The Company shall at all times maintain a comprehensive general liability insurance policy with a single limit amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) covering liability for any death, personal injury, property damages or other liability arising out of its construction and operation of the cable television system, and an excess liability (or "umbrella") policy in the amount of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000).

SECTION 17. INCORPORATION OF THE APPLICATION.

All of the statements and commitments contained in the Application or annexed thereto and incorporated therein, and any amendment thereto, except as modified herein, are binding upon the Company as terms and conditions of this consent. The Application and other relevant writings submitted by the Company shall be annexed hereto and made a part hereof by reference provided same do not conflict with application State or Federal law.

SECTION 18. COMPETITIVE EQUITY.

Should the Borough grant municipal consent for a franchise to construct, operate and maintain a cable television system to any other person, corporation or entity on terms materially less burdensome or more favorable than the terms contained herein, the Company may substitute such language that is more favorable or less burdensome for the comparable provision of this Ordinance subject to the provisions of N.J.A.C. § 14:17-6.7.

SECTION 19. SEPARABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or federal or state agency of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and its validity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance.

SECTION 20. PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

The Company shall not be required to disclose information which it reasonably deems to be proprietary or confidential in nature. The Borough agrees to treat any information disclosed by the Company as confidential and only to disclose it to those employees, representatives, and agents of the Borough that have a need to know in order to enforce this Ordinance Agreement and who agree to maintain the confidentiality of all such information, unless such information is deemed to be subject to New Jersey's Open Public Records Act.

The Company shall not be required to provide Customer information in violation of Section 631 of the Cable Act or any other applicable federal or state privacy law. For purposes of this Section, the terms "proprietary or confidential" include, but are not limited to, information relating to the Cable System design, customer lists, marketing plans, financial information unrelated to the calculation of franchise fees or rates pursuant to FCC rules, or other information that is reasonably determined by the Company to be competitively sensitive. The Company may make proprietary or confidential information available for inspection but not copying or removal by the Borough's representative. In the event that the Borough has in its possession and receives a request under a state "sunshine," public records, or similar law for the disclosure of information the Company has designated as confidential, trade secret or proprietary, the Borough shall notify the Company of such request and cooperate with Company in opposing such request.

SECTION 21. FORCE MAJEURE.

The Company shall not be liable or responsible for, in whole or in part, any delay or failure to

perform any of its obligations hereunder which may result from accidents, pandemics, floods, fires, earthquakes, tornadoes or other acts of God; war, acts of war (whether or not a declaration of war is made), civil disobedience; civil disturbance, sabotage or vandalism, customer tampering or interference, or act of public enemy; strikes, other labor or job actions or unavailability of materials or equipment; or other events or circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the Company.

SECTION 22. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES.

Nothing in this Franchise or in any prior agreement is or was intended to confer third-party beneficiary status on any member of the public to enforce the terms of such agreements or Franchise.

SECTION 23. NEW DEVELOPMENTS.

The Borough, for its part, shall endeavor to exercise reasonable efforts to require developers and utility companies to provide the Company with at least fifteen (15) days advance notice of an available open trench for the placement of necessary cable.

SECTION 24. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by law, and the issuance of a Renewal Certificate of Approval from the BPU.

SECTION 25. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to the portion of the Ordinance actually adjudged invalid and shall not be deemed to affect the operation of any other portion thereof, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 26. REPEALER.

All parts and provisions of any Ordinance which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
