 Ongoing Project Review The Committee reviewed the project list and determined next steps as needed.

DISCUSSION:

- Harvest Fair Planning/Preparation The Committee reviewed the materials for display at the booth and discussed the coverage schedule. Booth assignment - #243 near the Dam by the entrance to the parking lot on Main Street.
- The Committee discussed the intersection of Ward and Mercer, the site of
 the recent traffic fatality. The Mobility Plan design recommendations were
 discussed. Steve reported on recent and planned outreach to the state
 concerning Route 33 safety issues. Bev shared information from GMTMA
 on running a bike rodeo (bike safety event) in Hightstown with bike helmet
 give-away. The Committee discussed the need to engage the school
 district.
- Dave Zaiser reported on a visit to the Klapsogeorge home to watch the traffic on North Main Street. He agrees the traffic is moving faster, driving in the bike lanes and the left turns onto Wyckoff Mills Road are a hazard. He recommended we communicate these issues to the County as ongoing challenges. The Committee agreed.
- The Committee discussed Vision Zero and policy resolutions enacted by Lawrence and Pennington. Steve will bring it to Council for discussion. Vision Zero is a holistic approach to addressing safety. A resolution can be a policy statement only or it can also enact a task force to create an action plan. DVRPC has submitted an application for federal funding to create a Vision Zero action plan for it's entire planning area, which will encompass state routes. Mercer County is creating a Vision Zero action plan as part of the update to the county master plan transportation element that will encompass county routes. Princeton and Trenton have already established Vision Zero policies and a task force, and are creating their action plans. New Federal funding will be dependent on having a vision zero action plan in place.
- The Committee welcomes the new member, Henry Wang.

PUBLIC COMMENT (3 minutes or submit via email)

Chris Maher commented on the dangers at the Ward and Mercer intersection. Offered to help in working with the state on solutions.

Barbara Klapsogeorge thanked the Committee members for making an honest attempt to solve traffic problems. She is in favor of the bike lanes on North Main, but feels that it is has made a difference in a negative way in traffic. She also is concerned about increases in dump trucks due to nearby construction and Michael's Transportation buses stopping in locations that are not official bus stops. Wyckoff Mills Road and North Main continues to be a very bad intersection.

Revise truck ordinance. Dimitri reaching out to other municipalities about truck ordinances (including Allentown).

Need new ordinance

Carmela provided input on this proposal. The existing Allentown ordinance was not authorized by DOT. The new ordinance added a truck ban on local roads, which keeps them on the County Road. It required a traffic study, an engineering study showing turning radius, a County resolution of support and the Borough resolution must be sent to NJDOT for approval. It also adds a speed enforcement zone with mandatory court appearance. An addition to existing speed limit signs is required to say "strictly enforced" and mandatory court appearance.

Initial changes implemented in truck ordinance: changes in truck routes, all other streets designated for trucks less than 4 tons, school buses or local deliveries only. Completed.

Steve & Dimitri reviewed with Fred R and discussed with Council. Chief is on board. Will be reviewed with Judge. Will limit what streets commercial trucks 4 tons+ can use, except for local delivery. Speed enforcement zone mandatory court appearances. Fred R and Carmela working on mandatory court appearances. Ongoing. Need Update

Hightstown Engineer, Public Works

Mini Roundabout at Ward and Maxwell. Pilot painted roundabout. Public Works can easily lay down the paint, but they will need a layout guide from the Borough Engineer, which has been estimated at \$3,500 and recommended we purchase some signage as part of the pilot (we need funding/budget for signs).

County proposal to do the full infrastructure build design for \$12,283 and Borough would reimburse. Includes survey work. \$12K for "construction" (painted pilot)

Painted pilot 2022. After Bridge construction completed in 2023, seek funding for full construction if pilot works.

Steve and Dimitri to find out from Carmela and Ken Lewis what we need to purchase for budget recommendation

Council allocated \$3500 engineering expenses. Public Works estimate \$1,000

Still value even though the bridge is closed Pulled from budget due to issue related to the equipment needed to paint according to the Engineers specifications. Committee established to provide input into the County project. Concern is around the east and west approach. Recommended that the County and Borough meet to discuss coordination where the County project meets Borough roadway, with public meeting.

Committee dissolved by Mayor pending more definitive plan from the County.
