

The Hightstown Memorial Day Parade begins on Stockton Street at the Grace N Rogers Elementary School at 9 am, and will end on the corner of Morrison Avenue and Harron Avenue.

CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT JAMES P. KANA

CMSgt James P. Kana (Retired) was the Senior Enlisted Leader of the 514th Maintenance Group, 514th Air Mobility Wing, Joint Base McGuire-Dix- Lakehurst, New Jersey. He served as the principal senior enlisted advisor to the 514th Maintenance Group Commander, ensuring the professional development of the enlisted force and providing oversight of all maintenance matters for three squadrons supporting the KC-10A Extender, KC-46A Pegasus and C-17A Globemaster III flying operations. He ensured all maintenance personnel were effectively utilized, trained, and equipped to support rapid global mobility requirements.

A New Jersey native, CMSgt Kana enlisted in the Air Force and reported to Lackland Air Force Base, Texas in August 1985. Upon completion of basic military training, he attended technical training at



Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi graduating as an Avionic Navigations Systems apprentice in June 1986. He accumulated broad skillsets at the unit and group staff level to include: Flightline Maintenance Expediter, Unit Deployment Manager, Programs and Resources Manager, Wing Inspection Team Lead, and Quality Assurance Superintendent. CMSgt Kana was a Flying Crew Chief on the KC- 10A Extender, accumulating over 400 flight hours. He has four deployments and joint experience supporting numerous contingency and combat operations throughout the world and participated in Operations DESERT SHIELD, DESERT STORM, PROVIDE COMFORT, NORTHERN WATCH, SOUTHERN WATCH, JUST CAUSE, PROVIDE COMFORT, NOBLE EAGLE, ENDURING FREEDOM, IRAQI FREEDOM and INHERENT RESOLVE. CMSgt Kana has operational experience at home station or deployed locations on the following airframes: KC-10A, C-17A, C-141B and C-130E.


